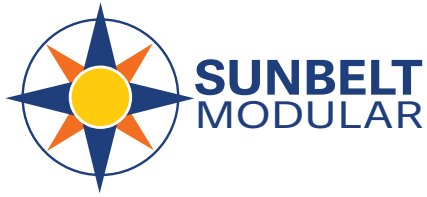

The objective was to provide safe, functional spaces that included essential services such as restrooms, showers, laundry, and meal preparation facilities—all within modest but impactful footprints.

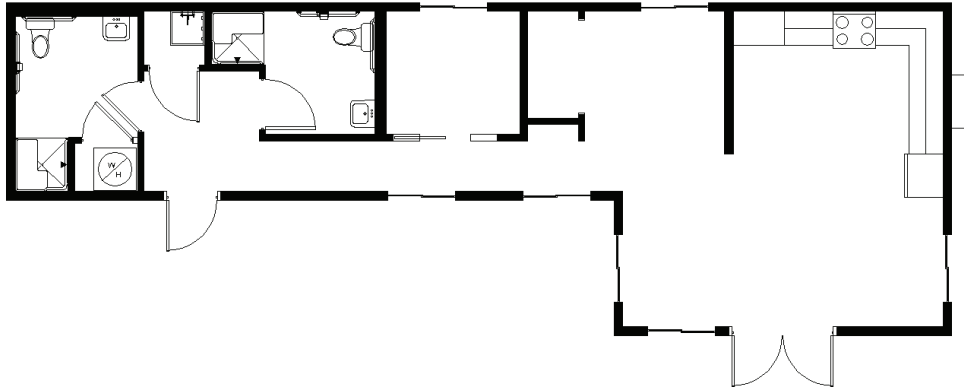

Together, they form the community center, designed to serve residents with restrooms, showers, laundry services, and fully equipped kitchens. The facilities provide a welcoming environment where individuals can regain footing and move toward independence. This project highlights how modular construction can quickly and effectively provide life-changing spaces for vulnerable communities.
